FLYING THE NORWEGIAN FLAG.
MORE THAN 30,000 SAILORS AND
NAVAL GUNNERS MANNED THE SHIPS.
MANY OF THEM LOOKED TO
NEW YORK, THE PRINCIPAL PORT OF
CALL AS THEIR HOME PORT DURING
THE WAR.
